This Indenture made the fifteenth day of August One thousand seven hun- dred and Eighty nine, and in the fourteenth year of American Independence Between Henry Linderman of the Greenville County and State of South Carolina Weaver of the one part, and John Linderman of the County and State aforesaid planter of the other part, Whereas in and by a certain grant bearing date the twenty first day of January One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty five, and in the ninth year of American Independence, from and in chief in and over the said State, and the great of the said State for that pur- pose appointed, Originally granted unto James M. Williams a plantation or tract of Six hundred and forty acres of land situate lying and being on Needy River above the antient boundary line, bounding on all sides on vacant land when surveyed and hath such shape form and marks as appears by a plat thereof, the said grant annexed, as in and by the said plat and grant duly recorded in the Secretarys office of the said State in book C.C.C. page 312 refer- ence therunto had may more fully appear. Now this Indenture Witness- eth that the said Henry Linderman for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds Sterling to him in hand well and truly paid by the said John Linderman the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said Henry Linder- man hath bargained, sold, remised, released, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain sell, remise, release convey and confirm unto the said John Linderman one hundred and forty acres of land being part of the said tract of Six hundred and forty acres, bounding N.E. by the said Needy River South East by a part of the said tract of Six hundred and forty acres laid out unto Matthew Armstrong South West by land granted to Hance Black, North West by land granted to the said James M. Williams, including one hun- dred and forty acres of land more or less.
