


Hereditaments and appurtenances as also the reversion and reversions, remainder & remainders rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said plantation or tract of one hundred and forty acres of land with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging to the only profuse and behalf of him the said John Linderman for and during the full term and term of one whole year from thence next ensuing and duly to be completed and made yielding and paying therefore unto the Henry Linderman the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars and twenty five cents to be paid to him by the said John Linderman at the time and place of payment of the same and shall be lawfully demanded to the intent and purpose and by virtue of the Statute for transferring of uses into possession he the said John Linderman may be in the actual possession of all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereunto belonging and thereby the better enabled to have take and receive the reversion and inheritance thereof which is intended to be made to him and his heirs granted and released by another Indenture intended to be made and dated the day next after the day of the date hereof. This Indenture made the fifteenth day of August One thousand seven hundred and Eighty nine, and in the fourteenth year of American Independence Between Henry Linderman of the Greenville County and State of South Carolina Planter of the one part, and John Linderman of the County and State aforesaid planter of the other part, Whereas in and by a certain grant bearing date the twenty first day of January One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty five, and in the ninth year of American Independence, from under the hand of his Excellency Benjamin Guerard Esquire Governor and commander in chief in and over the said State, and the great of the said State for that purpose appointed, Originally granted unto James N. Williams a plantation or tract of six hundred and forty acres of land situate lying and being on Reedy River above the ancient boundary line, bounding on all sides on vacant land when surveyed and hath such shape form and marks as appears by a plat thereof, the said grant annexed, as in and by the said plan and grant duly recorded in the Secretary's office of the said State in book 666 page 312 before these presents has may more fully appear. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Henry Linderman for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds Sterling to him in hand well and truly paid by the said John Linderman the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said Henry Linderman hath bargained, sold, remised, released, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain sell, remise release convey and confirm unto the said John Linderman one hundred and forty acres of land being part of the said tract of six hundred and forty acres, bounding N E by the said Reedy River South East by a part of the said tract of six hundred and forty acres laid out unto Matthew Armstrong South West by land granted to Hance Black, North West by land granted to the said James N. Williams, including one hundred and forty acres of land more or less. Together with all and singular the houses out houses edifices, buildings, stables yards gardens, orchards woods and under woods timber and timber trees, meadows pastures ponds lakes fishing ways water and watercourses paths passages Hereditaments and appurtenances and whatsoever may be thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions, remainders and remainders rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof.
