South Carolina Greenville County August the seventeenth One thousand seven hundred and eighty nine, A lease and release for two hundred acres of land from Thomas Srogin to Thomas Dogwood, produced in open court, being filed before James Blasingame Esquire, and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the second day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty nine, and in the thirteenth year of the Independence of the united States of America between Thomas Srogin of Greenville County and State of South Carolina planter of the one part, and Thomas Dogwood of the State and County aforesaid planter of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Thomas Srogin for and in consideration of the sum of two pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Dogwood the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Thomas Srogin hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell all that plantation or tract of land containing two hundred acres it being the whole tract of land granted unto Thomas Srogin by grant bearing date the second day of October One thousand seven hundred and eighty six Situate lying and being in the County aforesaid on Brushy Creek waters of Saluda River and when Surveyed bounded on all sides by vacant land having such shape form and marks as are represented by a plat thereunto annexed Together with all and singular the Houses, out houses, buildings, barns, Stables, yards, gardens, Orchards, woods, underwoods, timber and timber trees, meadows, pastures, ponds, lakes, fishings, ways waters, water courses, paths and passages, liberties, privileges, profits, Hereditaments rights, members and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion & reversions, remainders and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof, and every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said plantation or tract of two hundred acres of land with every the premises and appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the said Thomas Dogwood his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns from the day next before the day of the date of these presents for and during and unto the full end and term of one whole year from thence next ensuing and fully to be compleat and ended Yielding and paying therefore unto the said Thomas Srogin the rent of one pepper corn on the last day of
