




a stake on the No<sup>t</sup> line 19 chain from the lower end of the Tract it be-

The following deed of conveyance from James Neale To George Kiese was  
 Proven before Robert Nelson Esquire by the oath of Charles Smith and Recorded  
 this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of July A<sup>d</sup> 1790.

This Indenture made the Twenty Sixth day of February in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety and in the fourteenth year  
 of the Independance of the united States of America between James Neale  
 of the county of Greenville and State of South Carolina planter of the one  
 part & George Kiese of the same county and State aforesaid Planter of the  
 Other Part Witnesseth that the said James Neale for and in considera-  
 -tion of the Sum of one hundred Pounds Sterling money of the said State  
 to him in hand Paid by the said George Kiese his heirs Executors Administra-  
 -tors & assigns at or before the Sealing and delivery of these Presents the Receipt  
 whereof he the said James Neale doth acknowledge himself fully Satisfied
