


herby acknowledge and therefore doth Release acquit and discharge the said Albert Smithson his heirs Ex^{te}. adm^{or} by these Presents he the said Marsin Smithson Granted bargained sold aliened Enfeoffed convey'd and confirm'd and by these presents doth Grant bargain sell alien convey and confirm unto the said Albert Smithson and his heirs a certain Tract or parcel of land situate in the County of Greenville and district of ninety six on a branch of bridge creek of Saluda begining at a sower wood corner made on Alberts Smithsons line and laid out by parties consent it being part of a four thousand acre Tract of land Granted to Robert Prince it being by estimation one hundred and fifty acres more or less it being the land that the said Marsin Smithson bought of Robert Prince and laid out by consent of parties and Taken from the four thousand acre Tract Granted to Robert Prince the seventh day of March one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven and under the hand of his Excellency Thomas Pinckney Esquire and the Great Seal of the State for that purpose appointed and duly Recorded in the Secretarys Office Reference being thereunto had may now fully appear &c. with all houses buildings Orchards ways water water-courses profits commodities Hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Premises herby Granted or any part thereof belonging or in any wise appertaining and the Reversion and Reversions, Remainder and Remainders Rents Issues and profits thereof and also all estate Right Title Interest use property claim or demand whatsoever of him the said Marsin Smithson of in and to the said Premises and all deeds and Hereditaments herby Granted and of every part and parcel thereof belonging thereunto To have and to hold the aforesaid Tract of one hundred and fifty acres with the premises and appurtenances herby Granted unto the said Albert Smithson his heirs and assigns and to his and their proper use and behoof for ever and the said Marsin Smithson for himself his heirs Ex^{te}. adm^{or} shall and will warrant and for ever defend the said Premises to the said Albert Smithson his heirs and assigns against all lawfull claims and demands whatsoever which the above mentioned premises might or may be Incumbered or affected contrary to the True Intent and meaning of these presents In Witness whereof the said Marsin Smithson hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year first above written.
