said Joseph Wright and his heirs for ever all that Tract or Plantation of
land containing Two hundred and fifty acres more or less being and
lying on branches of S^o North fork of Saluda River with such courses
as the plat describes, beginning on a white Oak corner thence W to pine
thence S^o 47 W to Chesnut Oak + thence S^o 38 W. to the barn-break Tract
thence S^o to a hickory & thence to a stake + on W^o Thompsons Land
thence S^o 49 E. to Fosters branch and the various courses up s^o branch
to a conditional poplar Tree corner being part of a Tract of Land Granted
by his Excellency Charles Pinckney in the year one thousand Seven hundred
and Eighty nine in April together with all profits and benefits to the
use and behoof of him the said Joseph Wright his heirs and assigns for
ever and shall at all times hereafter Peaceably have hold possess and enjoy
S^o land and premises above mentioned without any hindrence or
Interruption of him the s^r Daniel Melley from or by him or any other
Person or persons whatsoever and lastly the said Daniel Melley do warrant and
for ever defend the same by these Presents In witness whereof I have here-
