

The following deed of Conveyance from James Blasingame to John Jones was proven before Robert Napwell Esq. by the oath of Benjamin Sarant Junr and Recorded this sixth day of November 1790.

This Indenture made this Twentieth ninth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Eighty nine and of the Independance of the united States of North America the fourteenth betwixt James Blasingame Esquire of the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina of the one part and John Jones of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Blasingame for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty Pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by the said John Jones the Receipt whereof the said James Blasingame doth hereby acknowledge he the said James Blasingame hath Granted Bargained and Sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth Grant Bargain and sell alien and confirm unto the said John Jones his heirs and assigns for ever a certain Tract or parcel of Land containing one hundred acres be the same more or less Situate lying in Greenville County and State of South Carolina being part of a Tract of containing eight hundred and eighteen acres Granted to the said James Blasingame from under the hand of his Excellency William Moultrie Esquire the then Governor by Grant bearing date the seventh day of August one thousand Seven hundred and eighty six and Recorded in the Secretarys Office Grant Book No. 11. 11. 11. page 133 reference therunto had may more fully appear the courses and bounds of the said one hundred acres of Land are as follows Beginning on a post Oak John Huggens corner and Running thence N 40° W 45 chains with the said Huggens line to a post Oak thence S 50° W 25 chains to a pine between two small branches, waters of Suluda River and bounded by part of the said Tract thence S 10° W to a post Oak one chain on the side of a small branch thence down the meanders of the said branch 36 chains to a white Oak on Worklaws line and bounded by part of the said Tract thence with the said Worklaws line to the beginning containing as aforesaid one hundred acres be the same more or less and also all Trees woods under woods Littles common common of pasture profits commodities advantages hereditaments ways waters and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Messuage or Tenements and premises above mentioned belonging or in any wise appertaining and also the Reversion and Reversions, Remainder and Remainders Rents and Services of the said premises and of every part thereof and all the estate Right Title Interest claim and demand whatsoever of him the said James Blasingame of in and to the said messuage Tenement and premises and every part thereof To have and to hold the said one hundred acres of Land be the same more or less and all and
