This Indenture made the tenth day of February one thousand seven hundred & ninety one in the fifteenth year of the Independence of America between Ambrose Blackburn & James Harrison of Greenville County & State of S^c Carolina of the one part and Crafford Goodwin of the aforesaid County & State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Ambrose Blackburn & James Harrison for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Pounds Sterling Money to them in hand paid at or before the sealing & delivering of these presents the Rec^t thereof is hereby acknowledged by them the s^d Ambrose Blackburn & James Harrison hath Granted Bargained sold Released and Confirmed & by these presents do Grant Bargain & Release unto Crafford Goodwin his heirs & assigns a Tract of Land containing Fifty acres be the same more or less being part of a Tract of Land Granted by his Excellency Thomas Pinckney Esq^r date the fifth of March one thousand seven hundred and Eighty seven to Ambrose Blackburn James Harrison & Recorded in the Secretarys Office Book T. T. T. Page 1061 Situate lying and being in 96 District North of Saluda River on the waters of the Golden Grove Creek bounded Southwardly by land laid out unto Merideth Blackburn, & Southeastly by John Bowins Land & Northwardly by John Napwells Land & on the west by land laid out to Ananias Wood & Saluda River Together with all Appurtenances thereunto belonging part & parcel thereof unto the said Crafford Goodwin his heirs & assigns for ever to have and to hold the said parcel of Land & being as aforesaid Together with all premises & every thing thereunto belonging and the said Ambrose Blackburn & James Harrison for themselves their heirs & assigns doth Covenant agree to & with the said Crafford Goodwin his heirs & assigns that he may at all times hereafter hold & possess without the aforesaid land without the least Molestation of them the said Ambrose Blackburn & James Harrison their heirs & Adm^r to him the said Crafford Goodwin his heirs & Adm^r we do warrant & defend the aforesaid land from all claim that now is or hereafter may be made by any person whatsoever Respecting or in the smallest degree affecting the said piece of Land lying & being as aforesaid unto the said Crafford Goodwin his heirs & assigns In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands & affixed our seals the day & year first above written.
