 States of America the fourteenth between Henry Hood of the state of South Carolina  
 and Greenville County of the one part and William Brown of the state and County  
 aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said Henry Hood for and in considera-  
 tion of the sum of Forty five Pounds sterling Money to him in hand well and  
 truly paid by the said William Brown at and before the sealing and delivery of these  
 presents the Receipt whereof the said Henry Hood doth hereby acknowledge he  
 the said Henry Hood hath granted Bargain and sold aliened and confirmed  
 and by these presents doth Grant Bargain and sell alien and confirm unto  
 the said William Brown his heirs and assigns for ever a certain Tract or parcel  
 of Land containing Ninety acres situate in Greenville County on the  
 south of Enoree River beginning at a maple corner on the River from thence  
 running south to a red oak corner from thence South East to post Oak station  
 from thence to a post Oak corner from thence North to a red oak station from  
 thence to a stake on the River from thence along the River to a Maple the beginning  
 corner together with all Woods Trees, waters watercourses profits commongoties  
 Appurtenances and hereditaments whatsoever thereunto belonging to have &  
 to hold the s<sup>t</sup> Tract Ninety Acres of land ally singular the Premises above  
 mentioned unto the said William Brown his heirs & assigns for ever to the only  
 proper use and behoof of him the said William Brown his heirs and assigns  
 for ever and the said Henry Hood for himself and his heirs the said tract nine-  
 ty acres with the appurtenances and every part thereof against him and his  
 heirs and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever to the s<sup>t</sup>  
 William Brown his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and forever de-  
 fend by these presents In witness whereof the said Henry Hood hath hereunto  
 set his hand and seal the day and date first above mentioned

 of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged have Granted  
 bargained sold aliened Released and confirmed by these presents do Grant  
 Bargain sell Release and confirm unto the said William Ray him his Heirs and  
 assigns for ever all that part of a certain Tract of Land lying and being in Greenville  
 County and on the waters of Horse Creek the waters of Reedy River Originally  
 Granted unto the said ~~the~~ <sup>266</sup> Weeks and signed by his Deponent William Moultrie  
 on the first day of May one thousand seven hundred and Eighty six for £10
