285 The following Deed of Conveyance from Henry Langford to Benjamin Smith  
 was produced in Open Court and proven by the Oath of John Duche and Or-  
 ders to be Recorded, which was done this 13<sup>th</sup> day of e May 1791

This Indenture made Twenty eight day of e November one thousand  
 seven hundred & ninety & in fifteenth year of Independence of e American  
 Between Henry Langford of Greenville County & State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina of the  
 one part and Benjamin Smith of the afores<sup>d</sup> County and State of the  
 other Part Witnesseth that the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Langford for & in consideration  
 of Fifty Pounds Sterling Money to him in hand Paid at or before the  
 sealing and delivering of these Presents the Receipt thereof is hereby  
 Acknowledged and him the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Langford hath bargained sold  
 Released and Confirmed and by these Presents do bargain Grant and  
 Release unto the said Benjamin Smith his heirs and assigns a certain Tract  
 of Land containing one hundred & thirty Acres being Part of a Tract of  
 Land Granted by his Excellency William Moultrie Esq<sup>r</sup> (dated 7<sup>th</sup> day of  
 August 1786) to Reuben Stringer Recorded in the Secretarys Office in Grant  
 Book N.N.N.N. Page 417 Situate lying and being in ninety six District  
 e north of Saluda River bounded South East by s<sup>d</sup> River Southwardly by  
 William Kelley & Blackstock and Eastwardly by John Hinson & Ambrose  
 Blackburn Lines Together with all Appurtenances thereunto belonging  
 part and parcel thereof unto the s<sup>d</sup> Benjamin Smith his heirs & assigns for ever  
 to have & to hold the s<sup>d</sup> piece of Land afores<sup>d</sup> Together with all premises &  
 every thing thereunto belonging and the s<sup>d</sup> Henry Langford for himself
