I WILEY all men by these presents that I John Wiley
of Greenville County State of S^t Carolina have this
day Bargained & sold to Robert Maxwell Esq^r of
the County & State aforesaid, one certain Negro Girl
about Ten years old ~~old~~ for the Valuable considera-
tion of thirty five pounds current & Money of the State
aforesaid, which Negro Girl I do hereby warrant
& defend from all Bills, Bonds, debts, dues, demands,
Gifts & Legacies, Mortgages, rights of dower, judgments
Executions, or Incumbrances whatsoever having
been had, made, or entered into before the sealing &
delivery of these presents In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal this 26th day of May 1792.
