nineteenth year of Independence of the United States of America between James Hawthorn of South Carolina in the County of York of the one part & Hardin Camp of the State aforesaid in the County of Greenville of the other part wheras in and by a certain Grant or Grants on bearing date twenty first January one thousand seven hundred and eighty four, the other bearing date the second day of March one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine, the one from under the hand of his Excellency Benjamin Goadard the other under the of his Excellency Charles Pinckney Esquire Governor for the time being did give and Grant unto James Hawthorn a tract of land containing one hundred & thirty seven acres of land in one tract, the other of eighty seven situate lying in Greenville County on Reedy river the whole tract being two hundred and Twenty four acres of land lying above the old Boundary line, it lying on both sides of the said Reedy River having such marks as are represented by a plat hereunto annexed, the said plat and Grant being duly Recorded in the Secretaries Office  
Witnesseth that the said James Hawthorn for and in consideration of the sum of five Shillings to him the said James Hawthorn in hand paid the Receipt whereof acknowledge he the said James Hawthorn hath granted bargained and sold, and by these presents doth Grant bargain & sell unto the said Hardin Camp his heirs & assigns all the above two hundred and Twenty four acres of land more or less and also all houses and out houses belonging thereto with all woods under woods tithes commons & common of pastures ways waters water-courses profits commodities advantages hindrances and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Tract or Tracts of land containing two hundred and Twenty four in (more or less) the whole belonging, or in any wise appertaining and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders rents issues profits of the said premises and of every part and parcel thereof and all the estate rights better Interest
