This Indenture made this tenth day of February one thou-  
sand seven hundred and ninety three and in the seventeenth  
year of American Independance Between Charles Sullivant  
of the State of South Carolina and Ninety six Bailiff of the  
one part & Hewlet Sullivant of the said State & District of the  
other part, It is covenanted that the said Charles Sullivant for in  
consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds Sterling  
Money paid by said Hewlet Sullivant to the Commissioners of  
the Loan Office in Charleston at and before the sealing &  
delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof he the said Charles  
Sullivant doth hereby acknowledge and from every part &  
parcel thereof do acquit and discharge the said Hewlet Sulli-  
vant him and his heirs and assigns, and for divers other good  
causes and considerations hereunto moving have granted  
bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these  
presents do grant bargain Enfeoff and confirm unto him  
the said Hewlet Sullivant his heirs and assigns for ever the  
upper half of a Tract of land lying and being in the District  
of Ninety six and on Reedy River it being part of a Tract of  
land Originally Granted to Charles Sullivant on the fifteenth  
day of October 1784 as by a plat thereunto annexed will fully  
appear Bounded on the North West by Joseph Dunklins  
land, and South West on said Hewlet Sullivants land, thence  
South East along the agreed on line between Moses and Hewlet  
Sullivant to Reedy River, it being two hundred acres of land be  
the same more or less together with all and singular the Houses  
out houses ways waters, paths passages Trees fences easements  
hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said  
plantation or Tract of two hundred acres of land or in
