

492 The following deed of Conveyance from H<sup>r</sup> Mr<sup>r</sup> Armstrong  
to William Thurston being proven before Robt. Wake Esq<sup>r</sup> by  
the oath of Isaac Green was Recorded this 24<sup>th</sup> June 1794  
This Indenture made the sixth day of December in the year  
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety  
three between William Armstrong and John Armstrong  
of the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina  
of the one part, and William Thurston of the aforesaid  
County and State of the other part witnesseth that the  
said William Armstrong and John Armstrong for  
and in consideration of the sum of five hundred  
pounds Sterling Money to them in hand paid will  
and truly by the said William Thurston, the receipt where-  
of is hereby acknowledged, they the said William Arm-  
strong and John Armstrong hath granted bargained  
sold alined, released conveyed and confirmed and by  
these presents doth grant bargain sell, alien and release convey  
and confirm unto the said William Thurston his heirs  
and assigns for ever in his actual possession now being  
one tract of land containing five hundred acres situate  
lying and being in the State of South Carolina and County  
of Greenville on the North side of Saluda river Includ-  
ing the plantation whereon the said William Thurston  
now lives, Beginning at a poplar and Runing N<sup>o</sup> 60 E<sup>t</sup> 40  
apine, thence N<sup>o</sup> 30 W<sup>t</sup> 20 a white oak, thence N<sup>o</sup> 60 E<sup>t</sup> q<sup>r</sup>  
66 to a red oak, thence S<sup>o</sup> 30 E<sup>t</sup> 15 to a red oak, thence S<sup>o</sup>  
60 W<sup>t</sup> 16 to an ash upon the River, thence up the river to  
the beginning, which said land was originally granted  
to Ann Armstrong by his Excellency William Moultrie  
Grant bearing date the second day of May one thousand  
seven hundred and eighty five, the same containing five  
hundred acres to have and to hold for ever the said grantee  
and bargained premises with all the appurtenances and  
privileges thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining  
to him the said William Thurston his heirs and assigns  
for ever to his and his heirs only proper use for ever the  
said William Armstrong & John Armstrong for themselves
