

195 The following deed of Conveyance from Joseph Maxwell to  
David Hall being proven before Reuben Barnett Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath  
of Thomas Maxwell was Recorded this 24<sup>th</sup> day of June 1794  
This Indenture made this fifteenth day of April one thousand  
seven hundred and ninety three between Joseph Maxwell of  
the one part, and David Hall of the other part both of the  
State of South Carolina and Greenville County Ninety six  
district witnesseth that the said Joseph Maxwell for and  
in consideration of the sum of three pounds Sterling Mar-  
cy to him in hand paid by the said David Hall the receipt  
whereof is hereby fully acknowledged that he the said Joseph  
Maxwell hath granted bargained and sold and alienated by  
conveyance and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien  
and confirm unto the said David Hall his heirs and assigns  
for ever all that plantation or Tract of land containing forty  
acres be the same more or less situated on Green Creek and  
State and County aforesaid Beginning on a post oak 34 ft on  
Samuel Eastleys line then 158 ft to a Gum & then 890 ft to a post oak  
34 then 100 ft to a post oak 34 then 158 ft to a post oak 34 then 50 ft to a post oak  
34 then 115 ft to a post oak 34 then 614 ft to a Chisel 34 by Deanean  
Campbells Survey No 8 21 to pine corner then to the begining  
of living land granted to Joseph Maxwell by the State aforesaid  
dated the fifth day of December 1791 Together with all woods  
waters mines hereditaments and appurtenances to the said  
land belonging or appertaining thereto and also the right to file  
or claim of said Joseph Maxwell unto the said land and premises  
is to have and to hold for ever the said granted and bargained  
premises with all the advantage appurtenances belonging or  
any ways appertaining thereto to him the said David Hall  
his heirs and assigns to his and their own proper use and behoof  
for ever, and the said Joseph Maxwell himself his heirs Esq<sup>r</sup>  
Adm<sup>t</sup> and assigns doth Covenant with David Hall that he the  
said Hall his heirs and assigns shall and may at all times for  
ever hereafter lawfully and peaceably enjoy and possess the afores-  
aid land with all the advantages thereto belonging and the  
said Joseph Maxwell his heirs and Esq<sup>r</sup> & assigns will lawfully
