

Begin with Almonat, Poole to Dillingham

The following Deed of Conveyance from William Poole to James Dillingham being proven before George Sulmon Esq. by the oath of John Young Jur. S. Record 28th July 1794

This Indenture made the Twentieth seventh day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four Between William Poole of Spartan County and of South Carolina Iron Master of the one part and James Dillingham of County State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Poole for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty six pounds Western Shillings of our pence Sterling Money to him the said William Poole in hand well and truly paid by the said James Dillingham the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said William Poole hath granted Bargained sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do grant bargain sell, alien convey and confirm unto the said James Dillingham his heirs and assigns forever in his actual possession now being, all that plantation tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and fifteen acres be the same more or less situate lying and being in Greenville County and State aforesaid on both sides of North Creek waters of Turn Beginning in a post oak on the west side of said Creek running thence South sixty eight degrees East seven chains to a stake called Thomas's Corner, thence South eighty two degrees East thirty chains to a white oak, thence North forty two degrees East thirty four chains fifty links, to a stake on Philip Sherrill's line, thence North twenty eight degrees west fifty five chains to a stake on a dead line thence South forty degrees West twenty five chains to a white oak on William Poole's line thence South twenty degrees East twenty two chains to a Chestnut
