526 The following Deed of Conveyance from James Stevenson
to Patrick Daly being proven before Reuben Barrett Esq^r. by
the oath of James Daly was Recorded this 5th Day of Nov. 1794

This Indenture made the Twenty eighth of June in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four in
the eighteenth year of the American Independence Between
James Stephen of the State of South Carolina and Greenville
County of the one part, & Patrick Daly of the State & County
aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that whereas in and
by a certain Grant bearing date the first day of January
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty
seven, under the hand of his Excellency William Moultrie
Esquire Governor & Command^r in chief in Gov^r. State
having the great seal of the State thereunto affixed did
give and Grant unto the said James Stevenson, a certain
tract or parcel of land containing by estimation two hun-
dred & sixty acres situate lying and being in Greenville
County & State afores^d on Fortinbury's Beaver Dam Creek
waters of Tygar River Begining at a Chestnut Corner & running
N^o W 37-50 to a Black Gum Corner thence S. 45 E 100 ft
