526 The following Deed of Conveyance from James Stephenson to Patrick Daly being proven before Reuben Barrett Esq. by the oath of James Daly was Recorded this 1st Day of Nov. 1794
This Indenture made the Twenty eighth of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four in the eighteenth year of the American Independance Between James Stephen of the State of South Carolina and Greenville County of the one part, & Patrick Daly of the State & County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that whereas in and by a certain Grant bearing date the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty seven, under the hand of his Excellency William Moultrie Esquire Governor & Commanded in Chief in & over the State having the great seal of the State thereunto affixed did give and Grant unto the said James Stevenson, a certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation two hundred & fifty acres situate lying and being in Greenville County & State afores. on Fortmuburg's Beaver Dam Creek waters of Tygar River Beginning at a Chesnut Corner & Running N 61st W 37-50 to a Black Gum Corner thence S. 74th W 110 W
