

The following probate respecting a Negroe was produced in Court  
 Feb<sup>y</sup> Term 1795 and Ordered to be Recorded which was done 27<sup>th</sup> Ap<sup>r</sup> 1795  
 South Carolina, Greenville County, - Joseph Gibson  
 came before me, and made oath that a certain Negroe named  
 Jude was to be given to Obidienne Gill on conditions that she  
 Married John Childress, & that he knew that she did Marry to  
 said John Childress, & that the Negroe was given up to said  
 Childress - Sworn to & Subscribed before me this 6<sup>th</sup> day  
 of February 1795

The following Deed of Conveyance from William Flippo to Wil-  
 liam Hammock being proven before John Blinquist Esq<sup>r</sup>  
 by the oath of J<sup>r</sup> Robinson was recorded this 27<sup>th</sup> April 1795  
 This Indenture made this 18<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year of our  
 Lord Christ 1794 between William Flippo of the County of Green-  
 ville & State of South Carolina of the one part, & William Ham-  
 mock of the County & State aforesaid of the other part things  
 eth that the said William Flippo for and in consideration  
 of the sum of fifty pounds sterling to him in hand paid by  
 the said William Hammock the receipt whereof the said Flippo  
 doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained & sold &  
 by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said  
 William Hammock a certain Tenement or tract of land lying &  
 being in the County aforesaid on a branch of the middle fork  
 of Saluda River being part of a Tract of a Tract of land  
 which was Granted the said Flippo, which will appear by a  
 Grant bearing date the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Dec<sup>r</sup> 1790 from under  
 the hand & Seal of his Excellency Charles Pinckney Esq<sup>r</sup> Go-  
 vernor and commander in chief in & over the said State beginning  
 at a Spanish oak a corner in the said land running thence 15<sup>th</sup>  
 6 39-15 to a chestnut another corner of said land thence 163 6 16  
 chain to a white oak, thence 15<sup>th</sup> 22 chain to a stake, thence 1  
 62<sup>th</sup> 13-50 to the beginning Spanish oak containing fifty acres  
 be the same more or less Together with all houses woods waters  
 water courses profits & Emoluments thereunto belonging or any  
 ways appertaining to have and to hold the said Land & premises  
 with the appurtenances to the only proper use & benefit of the S<sup>r</sup>  
 William Hammock his heirs and assigns free and clear from the  
 claim of myself my heirs or any other person or persons what-  
 ever and do bind myself my heirs &c. to warrant & defend
