 presented and recorded this 16th day of March 1798

This Indenture made the seventeenth day of April one thousand
 seven hundred and ninety two between James Hulsey of the State of
 South Carolina and Greenville County of the one part and John Ham-
 mond of the State and County aforesaid of the other part Witness that the
 said James Hulsey for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five pounds
 Sterling to him in hand paid by the said John Hammond the receipt where-
 of is here by acknowledged; for the said James Hulsey hath Bargained and
 sold aliened confirmed and by these presents doth Bargain and sell alien
 and confirm unto the said John Hammond this his and assigns all that plantation
 or tract of Land containing sixty five acres (with the same of several lots situate
 on the waters of Line Creek of Saluda River being part of one hundred
 and fifty acres of land granted to Charles Saxton by agreement bearing date
 the sixth day of February 1786, and Recorded in grant Book 2222 page 471)
 Preference being thereunto had had may more fully appear (and convey-
 ed from the said Charles Saxton to the said James Hulsey by deed bearing
 date the 12th Day of June 1787 Recorded in Clark's office in Law-
 rence County on the 4th day of July 1787 in Book B. page 133) together
