 and sold and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver to the said Edmund Bagg-  
 dale one or more such Horse rising five years old and finished of battle on horse head  
 Tobacco supposed to weigh two or three hundred weight Twelve Barrels of Corn and likewise  
 the third part of the profit of a certain mill on mountain creek known by the name  
 mill I have and to hold the said property and profit unto the said Edmund Bagg-  
 dale his <sup>ad</sup> <sup>ors</sup> and assigns to his and there own proper use and Behof forever  
 and the said Edmund Baggdale my <sup>ad</sup> <sup>ors</sup> and assigns from and against all persons  
 shall and will warrant and forever defend by all persons shall and will have  
 hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of February 1798 and the twenty  
 third year of the Independence of the United State of America Signed sealed  
 and delivered in presents of Larkin Baggdale

 fore James Blacklock by the path of Larkin Baggdale was present and  
 Recorded this 23rd of March 1798 The State of Carolina Know all  
 men by these presents that I John Ware of Greenville County in the State of Carolina  
 in consideration of twenty six pounds good and Lawful Money of the said State  
 to me paid by James Blacklock of Greenville County in the State aforesaid  
 have granted bargained sold and Released And by these presents do  
 Grant bargain sell and release unto the said James Blacklock all that plantation  
 or tract of land containing seventy two Acres and being in Greenville County  
 in Washington District on Branches of the upper river in a Branch of Soladawee  
 it being part of land purchased of John Bowie Esq. Beginning at a Black oak  
 corner from thence a long on old line Down to a Branch then to corner on a Maple tree  
 then Down the said Branch to the Mouth then up the Little Grove to the old line  
 and there to corner on a Sweet Gum Station Tree of the old Line; thence along  
 the old Line over East ward to a Black oak corner; from thence to the Beginning  
 to gilber with all and singular the Rights members hereditaments and appurte-  
 nances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appurte-  
 ning to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto  
 the said James Blacklock his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby bind  
 myself my heirs and assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singu-  
 lar the said premises unto the said James Blacklock his heirs and assigns  
 against my self and my heirs and against every person whomsoever~~
