74 The following deed of Conveyance from John Barclay to James
 Crawford & John Craig being acknowledged before Hilary Baker
 Mayor of the City of Philadelphia in the Commonwealth of Pennsyl-
 vania was presented and Recorded this 6th day of July 1798.

This Indenture made the first day of August in the year of our Lord
 one one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven between John Barclay
 of the City of Philadelphia Esquire of the one part and James Cra-
 wford and John Craig both of the same place Merchants of the
 other part witnesseth that the said John Barclay for and
 in consideration of two thousand five hundred Dollars to
 be paid to him by the said James Crawford and John Craig in hand well

75 and truly paid at or before the Execution of these presents the Receipt whereof
 is here by acknowledged hath granted bargained sold released and confirmed
 and by these presents doth grant bargain sell release and confirm unto the
 said James Crawford and John Craig and the Survivors of them his Heirs
 and assigns forever actual Possession now being by virtue of a bargain
 and sell to them there of made by the said John Parlay for the Term of
 one whole year in consideration of five Shillings in and by one Inden-
 ture bearing date the day next before before the Date of these
 presents all those several Tracts or Parcels of Land situate
 lying and being in the state of South Carolina one of them Number
 1. containing one thousand Acres situate in the District of Washing-
 ton in Greenville County on Gap Creek of the North fork of Saluda
 River bounded by lines running Northwest and North East by
 John Barnatts Land and North and North west by William McHenry's
 South west unknown South East by Bradfords Land one other of
 which said Tracts Number 2. containing one thousand Acres
 surveyed for Charles Bradford the eighth Day of March 1794
 Situate in said District of Washington in Greenville County aforesaid
 on the North fork of Saluda River bounded by lines running South west by
 Andrew Franks Land and surveyed Land South East and North west by said
 Bradfords North west by McElwath's One other of which said Tracts Number
 3. containing one thousand Acres surveyed for Charles D Bradford the
 eighth day of March 1794 situate in the said District of Washington
 in the County aforesaid on the waters of Saluda River bounded by lines
 running South East by McHenry Land South west by Plummers
 North West by Sperry East and west by Charles D Bradford one
 other of which said Tracts Number 4. containing one thousand Acres sur-
 veyed for Charles D Bradford the tenth of March 1794 situate in the
 said District of Washington in the County aforesaid on Gap Creek on the
 fork of the said Saluda River bounded by a line running South East by
 Vincent Andersons Land North East by Father Barnatts North west
 by Charles D Bradford's one other of which Tracts Number 5. contain-
 ing one thousand Acres surveyed for William and John Young 11th Day
