 of Mansel Crisp was presented and Recorded this 2^d day of April 1799
 The Indenture made the 30th day of May one thousand seven
 hundred and Ninety one and in the fifteenth year of the Independ-
 ence of America Between W^m S. Rodgers of Laurens County and
