Greenville County and State aforesaid Grand Insurance
of the sum of Two thousand one hundred and forty three dollars
to me paid by William Hunt of the State and County aforesd

Have Granted Bargained sold and released and by those presents do
Grant Bargain sell and Release unto the said William Hunt
a plantation State or part of Land containing five hundred and
forty four acres in the same manner less Situate in Greenville County
upon and on the North side of Saluda River being part of a tract
of five hundred and thirty five acres of Land Granted to me
the sixteenth day of July one thousand seven hundred and eight
ty four Beginning on a Box Cedar on the north side of Saluda
River running thence North fifteen degrees East to the place
where lowwood line crossing line there with said low
wood line with fifty five degrees West to lowwood stake
Corner thence North forty five degrees East to my own line
thence North fifteen degrees East to a pine my second corner
