220 The following deed of conveyance from Abraham Hargis to George Shelton being proven before John Sully Esq. by the oath of William Adams was presented and recorded this 21st day of May 1799. This Indenture made the 4th day of November one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight. Between Abraham Hargis of the state of South Carolina & Pendleton County of the one part & George Shelton of the aforesaid State & County of Greenville of the other part Witnesseth that the s^d Hargis for the consideration of fifty Dollars to him in hand paid by the said Shelton the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged & that the said Hargis have granted bargained sold unto the s^d Shelton part of a tract of Land lying on the waters of Saluda River it containing one hundred acres more or less it being part of a tract of Land originally granted to John Standsford by his Excellency William Moultrie Esq. the 1st day of February one thousand seven hundred & eighty seven beginning on a black oak corner of said tract thence nearly N. to a post oak thence N. to a Red oak it being a conditional line made between John Standsford & Abraham Hargis thence to a Red oak S^o 40^o 33' 6" Links to a white oak thence S^o 40^o W 1/4 chains to the beginning which by Estimation containing one hundred acres more or less the said Hargis Will warrant and forever defend the above tract of Land the s^d Shelton, his Heirs &c. Free & Clear from my heirs & From all & every person or persons whatsoever

221 The following deed of conveyance from Robert Goddett to Elisha Simmons being proven before David Goddett Esq. by the oath of James Goddett was presented and recorded this 25th day of May 1799. I know all men by these presents that I Robert Goddett of the State of Carolina Spartanburgh County have this 9th day of September 1797 in the 2nd year of American Independence have for an inconsideration of the sum of forty pounds to be in hand paid by Elisha Simmons of Greenville County & State aforesaid have granted bargained & firmly sold confirmed & fully released hereby unto the s^d Elisha Simmons all that tract of Land granted to me lying on Enore River in Greenville County known by the name of the walnut bottom which s^d tract bears date the 21st day of January 1785 in Record Book A 10 of the s^d County being therein to had well fully appear containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less together with all & singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging in anywise appertaining I have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned & sold unto the said Elisha Simmons his heirs & assigns forever in fee simple and I do bind myself my heirs Executors and
