Know all men by these presents that Samuel Vestels of Laurens County in the State aforesaid Farmer in consideration of seven ten dollars to me paid by John Norton of Greenville County in the State aforesaid Farmer have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Norton a parcel or tract of Land containing seven ten acres situate on a branch of Raybours Creek in Greenville County in the State aforesaid being part of a tract of Land originally granted to said Samuel Vestels bearing date the twenty first day of January One thousand seven hundred & eighty five containing two hundred and forty four acres beginning on and at being the south west corner of the original tract, and running N. 55. E. twenty chains to a stake, thence N. 35. W. eight chains and a half to a stake thence S. 55. W. twenty chains to a stake, and from thence to the beginning corner in closing the House which said John Norton now liveth in together with all and singular the rights manors hereditaments appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises as aforesaid unto the said John Norton his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises unto the said John Norton his heirs & assigns against myself and

The following deed of conveyance from Walter Burdell to Sape Baker being proven before Reubin Barute Esq. by the oath of John Baker Senr. was presented and recorded this 6th day of August 1799

This indenture made this thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine Between Walter Burdell of the one part and Sape Baker of the other part Both of Greenville County and State of South Carolina Witnesses that for and in consideration of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid by said Sape Baker before the sealing and Delivering of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged hath Bargained and sold and by these presents doth Grant Bargain and sell alien release confirm and convey unto Sape Baker his heirs and assigns forever part of certain tract of Land situate lying and being in the County and State aforesaid on the Sink hole fork of Tygha River Lying Land laid out to Comond Bearden and William Davois containing eighty nine acres Granted to William Lynch Seller and patent bearing date 21st Day of January 1785 the Conditional line Beginning at a Locust marked thus L F Running across said tract of Land above described a straight line to a Chestnut Oak closed from thence to a red Oak closed from thence to a black Oak from thence turning nearly an East course to a white oak an Comond Bearden line including all that part of the above named tract of Land lying on the East side of the above described Conditional line. Together with all woods ways waters water courses Improvements and appurtenances what so ever unto the same Belonging or in anywise Respecting or appertaining them to with the Rents Issues and profits thereof unto him the said Sape Baker his heirs and assigns forever and clear from all Incumbrances what so ever lawfully and quietly to enjoy the same to have and to hold the above Described Tract or parcel of Land unto the only proper use and behoof of him the said Sape Baker his heirs and assigns forever and he the said Walter Burdell for himself his heirs executors and assigns with the said Sape Baker his heirs and assigns doth release and
