George Graw the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge to the said Christopher
Brunk hath granted Bargained sold Conveyed and confirmed unto the said George
Graw his heirs & a certain tract of Land containing two hundred acres more
or less) situate in the county aforesaid in the Beaufort Creek Beginning at a
