

being proven before Hudson Berry Esq^r by the oath of James Holland was presented
and recorded this 12th day of June 1800
The State of Carolina Know all men by these presents that John
Mattox of Greenville County in the State aforesaid in consideration of
one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Samuel Neighbors of Laurens
County in the State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released
and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and release unto the
said Samuel Neighbors a plantation or tract of land containing
one hundred acres by the same more or less situate in Greenville
County by one undivided creek beginning on a stake 88

427 thence up the said Creek to a small Creek called the Beaver Creek to a Rock
38 thence up the said branch to the Head to a sapling 38 thence along the
fence to the road to a rock 38 thence to the Beginning being part of a tract
of land originally granted to Patrick Coffey on the sixth day of September
1785 and recorded in the secretaries office Book FFFF page 41
Together with all and singular the rights and members Hereditaments and appur-
tenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertain-
ing to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto
the said Samuel Neighbors His Heirs and assigns forever — And I do hereby
bind myself my Heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and
forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Samuel
Neighbors to him and his Heirs and assigns Against my self and my Heirs
and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim
the same or any part thereof. Will sign my Hand and Seal this 21st day
of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred &

427 The following deed of Conveyance from Joshua Thomas to Wm Jackson
being proven before Rubin Barrett Esq^r by the oath of John Lucas
was presented and recorded this 12th day of June 1800

South Carolina — Know all men by these presents that Joshua
Thomas of Union County in consideration of the sum of One hundred
and Fifty Dollars Starting Money to me paid by William Jackson
of Greenville County I have Granted bargained sold and released and
by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said
William Jackson a plantation or tract of land lying and being
in Greenville County on the waters of S^o Eggar River on a Creek known
by the name of the wild Oak Creek beginning on a post Oak Run-
ning on a Post Oak Running East 31-62 to a dog wood Stake then a N 31-62
to a Post Oak Stake thence W 31-62 to a stake by a dead pine thence
S 31-62 to the beginning corner by estimation one hundred and six
