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The follow Deed of Conveyance from Edward Hawkins to Philip Southwick being proven before Willy Brown Esq by the oath John Robuch was presented and Recorded this 21<sup>th</sup> day of June 1800

This indenture made this the fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine and in the Twenty fourth year of American Independence Between Edward Hawkins of Spartanburg County and State of Carolina of the one part and Philip Southwick of Greenville County and State aforesaid of the other part where as in and by certain Grants bearing date the third day of October Anno domini one thousand seven hundred and ninety one from under the hand of his Excellency Charles Pickens Esq Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the State of Carolina for that purpose appointed did give and grant unto John Gowen certain tract or parcel of Land containing of one hundred and fifteen acres be the same more or less lying on both sides of Mill Creek waters of South Carolina and has such shape form and marks as appears by a Plot to the said Grant named and the said Plot and Grant being Duly Recorded in the Secretaries Office for the said John Gowen Witnesseth that the said Edward Hawkins for the Consideration of Two hundred dollars to him in hand paid the Receipt whereof he has here by acknowledged the said Edward Hawkins hath Granted bargained & sold and by these presents doth Grant bargain and sell unto the said Philip Southwick or his heirs and assigns A plantation or tract of Land containing one hundred and fifteen acres be the same more or less beginning at an agreed corner on John McEvers line from thence to Post Oak corner on said McEvers line thence N. 61. E. 25 Chain along said line to a Post Oak corner thence S 25. E. 5 Chain to a Post Oak corner thence S 25. E. 5 Chain to a Post Oak thence S 30. W. 20 Chain & 20 Links to a stake thence S 44. E. 40 Links to a Post Oak & thence by an agreed line to the beginning Together with all and singular the Rights and profits and appertinances there to be longed or in any wise appertaining to have & to hold the said tract or Parcel of Land containing of one hundred and fifteen acres be the same more or less hereby Granted and sold with there and every of these appertinances unto the said Philip Southland his heirs and assigns forever and the said Edward Hawkins for himself his heirs and assigns shall and will defend the said bargain'd Premises against the claim of him self or his heirs or administrators or Executors and from all and every other Person or Persons Lawfully claiming or to claim hereafter or parcel of the above Premises Sign'd seal'd and delivered in presence of us this the fifth day of November 1799

435 State of Carolina - Know all men these presents that I John Kirkland of Greenville County in consideration of the sum of Sixty dollars to me paid by Elizabeth Embry of the County of Spartanburg have Granted bargained sold and Released and by these presents do Grant bargain sell and Release unto the said Elizabeth Embry a Plantation or parcel of Land lying in the County of Greenville and County of Spartanburg aforesaid the County line running through it on both sides of Mill Creek of S Carolina River beginning at a pine and running thence S 40. W. 30 Ch<sup>ns</sup> to a pine thence S 40 E 1 Chain to a post Oak thence S 30 W 13 1/2 Ch<sup>ns</sup> to a post Oak thence S 46 E 15 Chain 25 Lk<sup>s</sup> to a pine thence S 40 E 37 Ch<sup>ns</sup> to a stake thence S 40 W to the beginning containing by Estimation fifty acres be the same more or less being part of two Tracts of Land the Principal and greater part being granted by Patent bearing date January the first 1787 unto William Lemison and by him conveyed to John Gowen lying land below where said
