

The Following deed of Conveyance from Archibald Taylor to William Bullion being proven before Stephen C. Wood Esq. by the oath of John Bullion was presented and recorded this 2^d day of Feb. 1807

State of Carolina— Know all men by these presents that I Archibald Taylor of Greenville District S^c Carolina in consideration of Four hundred and fifty seven Dollars to me paid by William Bullion of District and State aforesaid have granted bargained sell & release unto the said William Bullion a tract of Land containing four hundred acres more or less situated on the south branch of Musk Creek in Greenville District on the south joining by Mrs. Miller's land on the west by Mrs. Tubbs land on the N^w by S^c Tubbs and Thomas and John's land to a red Oak corner of the lot thence on said Sheriff's line 65° & 65° to the road thence with the said road sixty poles to a post oak thence nearly S. E. to a Ridge thence the same course to the Beginning Together with all and singular the rights members Hereditaments and appertinances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Bullion his heirs and assigns forever and I do here by bind my self, my heirs Executors administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said Premises unto S^d W^m Bullion his heirs and assigns against my self & my heirs & assigns and every
