

154 The following deed of conveyance from Thomas Williams  
to Maacha <sup>Linville</sup> being proven before Hudson Bury Esq<sup>r</sup> by the  
oath of Wm Ross was presented and recorded this 5<sup>th</sup> March 1801

State of Carolina Greenville District

Know all men by these presents that I Thomas Williams  
of the District and State aforesaid do in consideration  
of the sum of thirty silver dollars to me paid by Maacha  
Linville of the state and district aforesaid have granted  
bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant  
bargain sell and release unto the said Maacha Linville all  
that tract or parcel of land containing sixty acres more  
or less. Beginning on a red oak pt then a S<sup>o</sup> 63<sup>o</sup> E 34 on  
Wm Ross<sup>s</sup> land to a pine pt then a S<sup>o</sup> 70<sup>o</sup> W 30. 50 on  
Benj<sup>s</sup> a Bruce land N. E. pt then a S<sup>o</sup> 30-70 on S<sup>o</sup> B Bruce  
land N. E. pt then to the beginning corner including  
sixty acres of land more or less. Together with all and singular  
the rights members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the  
said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appur-  
taining to have and to hold all and singular the premi-  
ses before mentioned unto the said Maacha Linville her  
heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby bind myself  
my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and  
for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto  
the said Maacha Linville her heirs and assigns against my  
self my heirs and assigns and against every Person or  
Persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the  
same or any part or parcel thereof being for value
