

Earle his heirs & assigns a good lawful & inalienable estate in fee simple to all and singular the premises before mentioned against myself and my heirs & against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this fifteenth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred, & in the twenty fifth year of the Independence of America —
