Hewlett Sullivan being proven before Hudson Berry Esq<sup>r</sup>  
by the oath of Sterling Camp was returned & recorded this 3<sup>d</sup> July 1807  
State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents  
Granville District - That I Abner Camp of the State &  
District aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of four  
Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Hewlett Sullivan  
of the State & District aforesaid have granted bargained  
sold & released unto the said Hewlett Sullivan & his heirs  
and assigns a tract of two hundred acres of land for the  
same more or less situate in Granville District lying on  
horse Creek beginning on a dogwood 3/4 on horse Creek  
running thence N<sup>W</sup> 44 chains up the said Creek with its  
meanders to a sweet gum 3/4 thence N 60° E 57 chains to  
a red oak 3/4 thence S E 44 chains to a stake 3/4 thence  
N<sup>W</sup> 60° 46 chains on Sterling Camps line to the  
beginning being part of a tract of 400 acres of  
land originally granted unto Mary Milling  
Together with all and singular the rights and mem-  
bers appertaining and appurtenances to the said premises  
belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold  
all and singular the premises before mentioned unto  
the said Hewlett Sullivan his heirs and assigns forever  
and the said Abner Camp do here by bind my self my heirs  
Executors and administrators to warrant and forever  
defend all and singular the said premises and every part  
and parcel thereof unto the above named Hewlett Sullivan  
his heirs and assigns against my self & my heirs and  
against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully  
claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof in  
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
