State of Carolina Greenville County, before me Hudson Berry a Justice for said County, personally came James Abercrombie and made oath in due form of law and to wit that he was present and did see Benjⁿ Brewer sign and as his act and deed deliver the within Deed of Conveyance to Warren Maysy for the use and purpose therein mentioned and that himself and Francis Pop both subscribed their names as witness to the same, sworn to & subscribed this 3^d day of March 1800. This Indenture made the seventh day of April 1801. between W^m Bullion of Greenville District and State of South Carolina of the one part and Benjamin Boswell of Greenville District & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said W^m Bullion for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred pounds and fifty p^{cs} to him the said W^m Bullion in hand paid and truly paid by the said Benjamin Boswell the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said William Bullion hath granted bargained sold alien released conveyed and Confirmed, and by these presents both grant bargain sell alien release convey and confirm unto the said Benjamin Boswell his heirs and assigns forever in his actual possession now being a part of the four thousand acres that were granted to Rob^t Paine, and a part that was granted to Nathol Taylor by a Grant bearing date the seventh day of ~~the~~ One thousand seven hundred and eighty seven in the hand of his excellency Thomas Pinckney Esquire Governor & Commander in Chief in and over the State of S^c Carolina and great seal of the State thereunto affixed & duly Recorded in the Secretaries Office of said State the same being here may more fully appear, Situate lying & being in Greenville District on both sides of a small branch of Bush Creek waters of Tyger River, beginning at a Hickory Corner
