that I Oliver Charles of the District of Pendleton State
aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of four hun-
dred dollars to me in hand paid by William Smith of the
District of Greenville the receipt whereof I do hereby
acknowledge have bargained sold and conveyed, and
by these presents do bargain sell and convey unto the said
William Smith his heirs and assigns - a Brown horse
about five years old - a White horse about Ten years old -
a Brown filly - a Roan filly - Fourteen head of Cattle -
thirty seven head of Hogs - three feather Beds & furniture
and all my household furniture: To have & to hold
