



 Tract or parcel of Land containing two hundred acres by Estimation
 Situate lying and being in the County of Greenville & State of South
 Carolina on a branch of Duck horn & branches of Mountain Creek
 Waters of Enore River, bounded by lines running N. E. & S. E. by said
 Whorton's own lines, the other Sides by Vacant Land, and hath such forms
 and marks as appears by a plat annexed to the Grant N^o. formerly
 granted to James Hollum, bearing date the 7th day of January 1793.
 together with all waters ways trees Mines Minerals Hereditaments &
 appurtenances therunto belonging or in any manner appur-
 taining. To have and to hold unto the said Whorton his heirs Executors
 Adm^r. & Assigns, the said Ephraim Reese do Covenant and agree
 to and with the said William Whorton that he will for himself his
