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The State of South Carolina, I know all men by these Presents that I Elton Hawtins of Greenville District in the State of said, Planter, in consideration of Thirty dollars to me in hand paid by John M. Clahanan of the same place, Have granted bargained sold and released unto the s^d John M. Clahanan, All that piece or parcel of land supposed to contain Eighteen acres be it more or less, Begining at a Maple near the mouth of a Small Branch which empties into Langstons Creek above the Waggon Road, near a Stone Quarry, thence down the said Langstons Creek (the old Channel thereof) with its various meander, to a Persimmon Tree near where a Ditch crosses the said Creek, thence up the various Meanders of said ~~back~~ Ditch (which E. Earle had cut) to the begining Maple, being part of a tract of 40 acres originally granted to Joseph Langston by His Excellency William C. Moultrie Esq: Together with all and singular the Rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining: To have and to hold all & singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said John M. Clahanan his
