 of Enoree at a shoal, thence up the several meanders of the said branch  
 untill it intersects Blackwells line thence up the said branch to the  
 fork, thence up the N. fork to the head, thence thence from the head to the  
 line, thence N. 65 W to the beginning corner stake, thence S 14 E  
<sup>63° 70'</sup> to corner Red Oak, thence S. 60 E 13.50 links to Black Jack corner  
 thence N. 22 E W along said Tidb's line till it intersects the line branch  
 thence down the several meanders of the said branch, to the second Fork  
 thence from the Mouth of the second fork to pine corner thence to the begining  
 Containing two hundred acres more or less - Together with all and singular  
 the rights numbers hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises  
 before mentioned unto the said Thomas Benson his heirs & assigns for ever  
 And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant  
 and defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said  
 Thomas Benson his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs and against  
 every person whomsoever lawfully claiming n'to claim the same or any part  
 therof. Witness my hand and seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of November in  
 the year of our Lord 1802. & in the twenty seventh year of the  
 Independence of the United States of America -

58 This Indenture made this seventeenth day of December One thousand eight  
 hundred and two between William Tidb. Sen. of the State of South Carolina  
 and District of Greenville of the one part and Moses Land of the State  
 and District aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William  
 Tidb for the Consideration of the sum of one hundred dollar paid by the  
 said Moses Land the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, that  
 the said Tidb have granted bargained and sold unto the said Land  
 part of a tract of Land Originally granted to old Mr. Turnbow lying  
 on the Water of Enoree river beginning at a black Jack corner from  
 thence along the old line to a pine, thence along said old line to a  
 Blk Oak thence across a conditional line to the Beginning -
