All that Tract or parcel of Land containing One Thousand Acres of land originally granted to said Penwell Wood by Patent bearing date the Third day of December in the year one thousand Seven hundred and Ninety eight Recorded in Grant Book S. No. 5. Page 323. Situate in Spartanburg District in the State aforesaid on both sides of Burnt Creek water of Egger River and some branches of Egger River bounding on Manly Ford land Morrison & Samuel Burns lands and all round a Tract of one hundred two acres originally granted to Arasmus Nobles. and hath such shape and form as will more fully appear from a plat annexed to said Grant. Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining therunto and the said Penwell Wood doth hereby bind himself his heirs executors & adm^rs to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the above described premises unto the only proper use and behoof of him the said James Kilgore his heirs executors adm^rs and assigns for ever against him the said Penwell Wood his heirs executors & administrators and no further.
