post oak corner $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1}{2}$, thence to Stake Co^r $\frac{1}{2}$ thence No^o to a Post oak Co^r $\frac{1}{2}$, thence to
a Brad oak Co^r $\frac{1}{2}$, thence No^o to a pine tree Co^r $\frac{1}{2}$, thence the^t to pine Co^r $\frac{1}{2}$, on land
laid out for Pe^t Wherton, thence So^h $\frac{1}{2}$ Ea^h on S^d Wherton line to the middle of
beaver dam, down the middle of the same, the begining part being a grant originally
granted to Ob^t Cooper and part of a grant originally granted to Eli^t young the
wife of George Salmon, including all within the above mentioned boundaries the same
more or less, Together with all and singular the Rights, members, hereditaments,
and appurtenances to the s^d premises belonging, or in any wise appertaining, To have and
to hold all and singular the premises, before mentioned unto S^d Dan^t Kelley his
heirs, Executors & administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular
the said premises unto the s^d Dan^t Kelley his heirs & assigns, against myself
and my heirs and against, every other person whomsoever, lawfully claiming
or to claim the same or any part thereof, witness my hand & seal this 29th day
August in the year of our Lord 1803 — and in the 27th year of the Independence
of the united States of America — — — — —
