The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I John Macbeth of Union District in the said state for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & twenty five Dollars to me in hand paid by Jeremiah Cleveland Have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland all them two certain lots of land supposed to contain one acre (more or less) situate lying and being in the village at Greenville Courthouse known and distinguished in plan or chart of said village by numbers 37 & 38 adjoining each other and begining on a stake corner running thence S. 74° 72' E. 235 feet (on the side of the street) to a stake thence S. 15° 1/2 W. 140 feet to a stake thence N. 74° 72' W. 235 feet to a stake thence N. 15° 1/2 E. 140 feet to the begining No. 38 having been conveyed from Lemuel Alston to me the said Macbeth the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Sept. 1800 — & N. 37 having been conveyed from s. d. Alston to John W. Wood the 8<sup>th</sup> day of August 1799 and from the said Wood to me the 29<sup>th</sup> day of August 1800.
