

Know all men by these presents that we Alexander Barnhill & Nelly his wife of the state of South Carolina & District of Greenville have this 16th of February 1804 Have for & in Consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by John West of the State & District above mentioned Have freely bargained & firmly sold confirmed & fully released hereby unto the said John West a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the District of Greenville on the east side of Enoree river on branches of said river containing one hundred & fifty five Acres more or less Beginning on a black Oak & running N. 68. E. 14 to a post Oak thence S. 60. E. 18. 50. to a post Oak thence N. 20. E. 25. to a stake thence N. 8. to a stake thence N. 67. W. 59 to a stake thence S. 30. - 00. to a pine thence a mark? Conditional line to the beginning which s. tract of land containing one hundred & fifty five Acres more or less Together with all & singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining To have and to hold all & singular the premises before mentioned & sold unto the said John West his heirs & assigns forever & we do forever defend all & singular the aforesaid premises unto the said John West his heirs & assigns forever Against our selves our heirs & all & singular every other Person or persons whatsoever from setting up any lawfull claim to the same unto any part thereof In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals the day & date above written & signed sealed & acknowledged in presence

Cool is seized in fee simple him & his heirs forever a certain parcel or tract of Land containing one hundred & thirty seven acres lying & being on Chick Thompsons. Beaver dam Creek, in the District aforesaid, beginning on a red Oak running N. 28. S. 60. W. 16 to a red Oak thence N. 68. E. 25. S. 1 to a red Oak thence S. 40. E. 33. S. 1 to a white Oak thence S. 60. W. 12 S. 1 to a post Oak thence S. 75. W. 14 S. 1 to the Beginning & whereas Stephen Dill did in March term Eighteen
