W. to a white oak on the branch thence down the branch to Barnes branch thence down Barnes branch on Varnous line to Pices line thence with Pices line to a maple in the head of a house prices corner thence a straight course for Alex Blytons Beginning corner to a stake on the ridge path thence W. along said path to the beginning, Together with all and singular the rights her appurtenances and appurtenances to the said premises belonging in any wise appertaining, I have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned to the said Alex Jordan & his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns for ever, and he the said John Rofson & his heirs Executors & Administrators shall and will warrant and forever defend as well in Equity as in Law all the said tract of twenty acres unto the said Alex Jordan his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns from all and every person or persons laying any lawfull claim or claims to any parcel or part thereof - In Witness whereof I the said John Rofson hath hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of October one thousand eight hundred and three - Signed sealed and delivered in Presence of us, Joseph Barrell }

Acres granted by Patton to Benjamin Kilgore Junr on the third day of Sept^r in the year 1792 & situate in the State and District aforesaid on the south side of Belts Branch, waters of Enorce river, Beginning on a pine corner on the S. side of said Branch & runs on a marked line S. E. ward to a white oak corner, on the Bank of a small branch thence down said branch to a chestnut Penwell woods low across said branch thence on said line N. 20. W. to where said line
