Recorded in Grant book S<sup>c</sup> page 409. the other originally granted to Isaac James 1789; the said tract of land situate in the said District of Greenville lying on the waters of horse creek & Mountain Creek by Estimation to be 185 Acres more or less Beginning on a Sec: Soil Eastes corner running thence S 40. E. 3/4 to a pine then N. 25. W. 1/2 to a Sec: thence N. 65. E. 4/7 50. to a stake S 25. 6. 1/2 State N. 9. E. 1/4 post o, and thence it is supposed W<sup>m</sup> Mullican's Land Interests which is Excepted to said Mullican & then from said Post Oak N. 80. W. 60. to a black jack then S. 89. W. 10. to a black oak S. 15. W. 1/4 to a ash thence to the Beginning. Including the plantation where said Jo<sup>h</sup> Dewese now lives, Together with all and singular the rights membership membership hereditaments and appurtenances to said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all & singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said Jo<sup>h</sup> Dewese his heirs & assigns forever: & I do hereby bind myself my heirs Ex<sup>ors</sup> & adm<sup>ors</sup> to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Jo<sup>h</sup> Dewese his heirs & assigns against myself & heirs & against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
