404 State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that I John Thomas of Greenville district, in the State aforesaid In consideration of one hundred and Sixty dollars paid by Robert Carter of the district and State aforesaid, I have granted bargain'd and Sold and Released, and by these Presents do grant bargain Sell and Release unto the said Robert Carter (now in his Possession) a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing forty acres (being part of a tract of six hundred and forty acres, Originally Granted to Major Parsons, by him conveyed to Thomas Todd, & by him to said John Thomas) which said forty acres lies on the South Western corner of said tract of six hundred and forty acres, Beginning at a Dogwood, on the South side of the South Tyger River, running S. 4° W. 47° 58' to a post oak, thence S. 83° E. 8. 43. to a Stake in a field, thence N. 7° E. 47. 50. to a gum near the said river then by a straight line to the Beginning --

Togethers with all and Singular the right hereditaments, members, appurtenances to said a forty acres of land, belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining -- To Have and To Hold - all and Singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Robert Carter his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and Singular the said Premises unto the said Robert Carter his heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs, and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the ^{same} or any Part thereof - Witness my hand and Seal the 9th day of July 1805 -
