State S. Carolina Greenville District. Know all men by these presents that I Joshua Beaton of the State and district aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of 150 dollars to me in hand paid by Devereaux Yergain of the State and District aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release unto the said Devereaux Yergain all that plantation or tract of land, it being one hundred acres more or less, it a part of a tract that was granted of 1000 acres to the said J^r Powell it being in Greenville district & lying on a branch of Gilder creek & bounded on & lying in between the land hereafter mentioned that is to say Beginning at a Stake in James Peeks line it being Andrew Yergains corner in a branch of Gilder thence up sd branch & cornering to a Stake with sd Yergain in a branch in J^r Scrungs line thence bounded by J^r Scrungs line & cornering to a Stake in Horatio J^r Pitts line thence with sd Griffins line & J^r Peeks to the Beginning corner, Together with all and Singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the said Premises Belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To Have and to Hold all and Singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said Devereaux Yergain his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors administrators to warrant and forever defend all and Singular the Premises unto the said Devereaux Yergain his heirs & assigns & against myself my heirs or any other person lawfully claiming the same.

This Indenture made this eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and four, and in the twenty eighth year of American Independance. Between John Rice of South Carolina & Greenville county of the one part, & Samuel Moore of the State & County aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Rice for & in consideration of the sum of one hundred Dollars to him in hand paid hath granted bargained sold and released conveyed & by these presents do confirm unto the said Samuel Moore his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns forever all that plantation & tract of land wherein the said John Rice now lives, an containing fifty acres be the same more or less. Beginning on a red oak on the north side of the wagon road, that leads to Green river cove, thence along said road to a Spanish Oak, thence with Hugh McCall's line to a Spanish oak, thence S. Wardly to a chestnut, thence Westwardly to a chestnut thence on a conditional line to a maple corner on Beavardam creek, thence down said creek to a white oak, thence to a pine not on Kelly's line thence to a Spanish oak thence to the beginning
