The land to be conveyed Begins on a Stake or. Nub, S. 42. E. 24. 50 <sup>ch.</sup> coming to B. Jack st then S. 13. 65. across the said creek coming to pine stump st then S. 50. W. 32. 79. Bounded by Gilliband Land to pine st on the N. 42. W. 24. 67 to Stake by Kellys fence then by a conditional line N. 40. E. to Pine in the hollow near the path that leads from the said Butler to the Kellys then up the various Courses of said hollow to the Beginning. Including one hundred acres be the same more or less - Together with all and singular the rights, members, Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in any wise Incident or appertaining. To Have and To Hold all and singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said John Butler his heirs and assigns forever. and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & administrators unto the said John Butler his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and assigns against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the the same or any part thereof - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th day of August in the year of our Lord 1800 Signed and delivered in presence of

This Indenture made this fourteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred & five. and in the twenty ninth year of American Independence. Between Paul Abney of the State of South Carolina and Greenville District of the one part. and James Taylor of the said State and District aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Paul Abney for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to one in hand paid. Hath bargained & sold unto the said James Taylor a plantation or tract of land containing two hundred acres more or less. lying and being in Greenville District on the road from Greenville Courthouse to Spartanburg Courthouse on Brushy Creek the waters of Moore River, Beginning at a pine running thence to the head of the Spring branch and down said branch to the creek a conditional line running up said creek to the next branch. and coming up said branch to the road and up said Road to William Fergusons line running thence a conditional between Paul Abney & William Ferguson to said Fergusons corner on a maple thence up said branch to William Taylors line thence along said line to the pine or Beginning. it being part of a tract of land originally granted to Isaac Morgan - Together with all singular the Houses, gardens, orchards, woods, & Waters. To Have and To Hold the said Plantations
