Pinnell of Greenville District in the State of aforesaid, in Consideration of the sum  
of five hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Samuel Williams of the State and district  
aforesaid, hath granted, bargained, sold, and Released, and by these Presents do  
grant, bargain, sell, and Release, unto the said Samuel Williams all that tract or  
parcel of land containing one hundred acres more or less situated in the said  
district. Beginning on the bank of the Grove Creek on a Hickory Corner, Running  
N. E. up the mearings of said Creek, to the mouth of the Doe branch on a Holly x m  
thence N. E. up the mearings of said branch to a sweet Gum x m thence a straight  
line to a black oak on the rocky fork, thence S. W. down said branch to W. Holliday's  
line thence along said line to a Post oak x m. thence a straight line to the beginning Hickory x m

Together with all and singular the Rights members Here detaments and appurtenances  
to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have & To Hold  
all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Samuel Williams his heirs &  
assigns forever, and I Peter Pinnell Jun: do Hereby bind myself my heirs and assigns to  
warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said Samuel  
Williams his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs & assigns and against every other  
Person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - As witness my
