Know all men by these presents, that we Daniel Eanes & Joseph Petty Pool for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred dollars to us in hand paid by Erwin Patton of Cleveland, have bargained sold and delivered and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver unto the said Erwin Patton of Cleveland a mulatto man named George about 28 or 30 years of age, which said negro we do warrant to be sound, healthy and sensible and a Slave for life; also that the said negro is free and clear of any incumbrances or impediments, Judgments, Gifts, entails, or mortgages whatsoever — and we do jointly & severally warrant and will forever defend the said negro man George unto the said Erwin Patton & Cleveland their heirs & assigns against every other person or persons. Witness our hands and seals this nineteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and eight, Erwin & Patton intimated his two places before signed. Articles of agreement entered into this nineteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and eight between Daniel Eanes of the District of Abbeville and State of South Carolina of the first part, and Joseph P. Pool of the town of Petersburg & State of Virginia of the second part. Witnesseth that whereas the said party of the first part being at the time prosecuting in the District Court of Greenville and State of said three several suits to wit, one against William Robertson for two negroes to wit, George & Charles, one other against Elias Earle for negro boy named Ephraim, and one other suit against David Reid for negro boy named Peter which said four negroes the said party of the second part profess a claim to and the said party of the first part and the said party of the second part, being equally desirous of making a friendly arrangement, agree upon the following conditions (Wit. The said party of the first part agrees to withdraw the suits first above named upon his getting two of the above negroes to wit Peter & Ephraim upon the said
