N. 36.5 to a stake, thence E. 36.5 to a stake, thence S. 36.5 to the beginning corner on  
a stake containing by estimation one hundred and thirty acres, more or less  
the same being a tract of land granted to Arthur Parrett by patent bearing  
date the twenty third day of August in the year one thousand seven hundred  
and ninety two under the hand of Charles Pinckney Esq. then Governor of
